ADVISING AND COURSE SELECTION

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

The College of Arts and Sciences Academic Advisors are committed to helping students make a successful transition to Trinity Washington University. By practicing the Appreciative Advising model, Academic Advisors support students as they navigate their scholastic journey and university life. In consultation with your advisor, you will take part in course planning and selection, long term academic planning, major exploration, and career path discovery. If you need assistance with the advising process, you should contact the professional advisors (email: CASadvising@trinitydc.edu; visit: www.trinitydc.edu/cas-advising).

SCHOOL OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

You should select and submit your courses in Self-Service after reviewing your academic degree plan to determine which courses meet your degree program requirements and fit your schedule. As you select courses, be sure that you understand which courses fulfill core, major, or elective requirements. You should also review the Catalog and the schedule to be certain that you have completed all appropriate prerequisites for the courses you have selected. If you choose not to take courses in sequence or when they are available, you might not progress to degree completion as planned. If you have questions or concerns, please contact your academic advisor before submitting courses. You may contact your advisor by e-mail or set an appointment by calling the School of Professional Studies at 202.884.9620 (Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM; Saturday 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM). You can find the School of Professional Studies in Main 250.

First-year Students (24 credits or less): You should review your academic degree plan with your advisor before selecting and submitting your courses in Self-Service each semester to ensure you are taking courses in an order that assists you in attaining academic success and in meeting prerequisites for your major and for electives. You should also meet with your advisor at least twice each semester during your first vear at Trinity.

Seniors (88 credits or more): You should review your academic degree plan with your advisor before selecting and submitting your courses in Self-Service to ensure you are not missing courses or degree requirements that would prevent you from graduating.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND **GRADUATE STUDIES**

You should select and submit courses in Self-Service after reviewing your academic plan to determine which classes meet your program requirements and fit your schedule. You should also review your academic plan to be certain that you have completed all appropriate prerequisites for the courses you have selected. Choosing not to take courses in the order suggested by your academic advisor, or when they are available, may delay degree completion. If you have questions or concerns, please contact your academic advisor before submitting courses. You may contact your advisor by e-mail or set an appointment by calling the School of Business and Graduate Studies at 202.884.9640.

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

Graduate students in the School of Education should contact their advisor prior to registration each semester to determine appropriate courses for which to register. You should have frequent contact with your advisor to ensure that you are meeting both degree and certification requirements.

Undergraduate students pursuing an AA, BA or minor in education should follow the registration procedures for their collegiate unit. Additionally, you should check with your advisor each semester to ensure that your general education or core and your major courses conform to your approved academic plans.

SCHOOL OF NURSING AND HEALTH PROFESSIONS

Students may apply to be admitted to the Nursing Program following completion of pre-requisite and general education or core requirements as listed in Trinity's Catalog. For questions, contact the program at 202.884.9670. Students admitted to the program will meet with the academic advisor for nursing prior to starting NURS courses in order to review the nursing curriculum plan. Then each student will be assigned a nursing faculty advisor during the first semester of nursing courses.

Students may apply to be admitted to the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program following completion of pre-requisite courses as listed in Trinity's Catalog. For questions, contact the program at 202.884.9671. Students admitted to the program will meet with an OTA faculty advisor prior to starting OTA courses in order review the OTA curriculum plan. Each student is assigned a faculty advisor for the duration of the OTA program.

Graduate students in the School of Nursing and Health Professions should contact their faculty advisor prior to registration each semester to determine appropriate courses for which to register. You should have frequent contact with your advisor to ensure that you are meeting both degree and clinical requirements for your respective program.

NHP Students: Prior to each semester's registration period and before selecting and submitting your courses for registration in Self-Service, each student should review your academic de-

gree plan with your advisor to ensure that you are taking courses in the sequence outlined and meeting academic and clinical requirements for progression within the respective NHP program. NHP programs outline specific progression for course completion. Students are expected to meet with their academic advisor at least once each semester to review their program's outlined course sequence.

NHP programs entail required clinical or fieldwork components. Students must complete clinical requirements in a timely manner to be eligible to participate in clinical or fieldwork experiences. Students are to consult their program's policies and their respective clinical or fieldwork coordinator regarding clinical requirements and deadlines. Documentation of completion must be submitted prior to participation in any clinical or fieldwork rotation. Clinical requirement deadlines often occur significantly in advance of course registration.

Students may be placed in a clinical or fieldwork rotation only if clinical requirements are documented as complete. Students should note that clinical or fieldwork sites sometimes require additional steps that take 2-3 weeks to complete. A student may be ineligible for clinical or fieldwork placement if a drug test or criminal background check shows positive results. A felony conviction may affect a student's ability to secure a clinical or fieldwork placement which will prevent a student from completing degree requirements for graduation. A felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for a national licensure examination or attain state licensure.

REGISTRATION

RETURNING STUDENT REGISTRATION

All continuing students must complete online registration using Self-Service at selfservice. trinitydc.edu. Self-Service uses a shopping cart function similar to many retail web sites. Remember that if courses are still in your shopping cart, you have not actually "purchased" them yet; you must submit your courses for approval via Self-Service. Once your advisor has approved your courses, your registration will be finalized.

The Self-Service link (selfservice.trinitydc. edu) has a Help Guide as well as a link to use if you have lost or have not received your username and password. Please consult the Help Guide if you need help registering. If you continue to have difficulty, you may contact the Office of Enrollment Services in Main 154 or at 202.884.9530.

COURSE & SCHEDULE INFORMATION

ADD/DROP PERIOD

You are permitted to change the courses for which you are registered in Self-Service without incurring additional charges during the Add/Drop Period. (See the Academic Calendar in this schedule booklet for specific dates by session.) During this period, you may drop a course that you are registered for or add a course to your current schedule. After the Add/ Drop Period has ended, you will be charged for any course for which you are registered, and a record of these courses will appear on your official transcript. You must complete all registration by the end of the Add/Drop Period.

WITHDRAWING FROM COURSES

Once the Add/Drop Period has passed, a course may not be removed from a student's academic record for any reason. Students may, however, still withdraw from a course at any time up to the deadline for withdrawal; dates are listed in the Academic Calendar. When a student withdraws from a course, a designation of "W" (Withdrawal) will appear on the student's transcript. Students who fail to withdraw officially or to meet course requirements are subject to receive a grade of "F" (Failure). Students are responsible for payment for courses from which they have withdrawn. Financial aid recipients who withdraw are subject to federal refund and repayment requirements. To withdraw from a course, students should follow the following steps:

- Obtain a Course Withdrawal Form in the Office of Enrollment Services or at www. trinitydc.edu/enrollment/general-student-forms
- Fill out and sign relevant sections of the Course Withdrawal Form
- Confer with academic advisor to discuss how withdrawing from the course will affect academic plans
- Obtain the signature of student's academic advisor
- Return signed form to the Office of Enrollment Services by the withdrawal deadline, at which point a grade of "W" will be entered for the course on your transcript

ROOM ASSIGNMENTS

Check Self-Service for classroom assignments. Room assignments are also posted on the kiosks in the Well adjacent to the main entrance to Main Hall, in the Main Hall basement, and the

lobby of the Payden Academic Center. Room assignments may change leading up to and during the first week of class. Check Self-Service just before the first meeting of your class to confirm the room assignment for your class(es).

CANCELLATION OF COURSES

Occasionally it is necessary to cancel a scheduled course because of low enrollment, emergency staffing changes or other unavoidable reasons. Every effort is made to announce a cancellation before the first class meeting, but this is not always possible. If a course is cancelled after its official start date, a student who does not choose to transfer to another course may receive a full refund of the tuition and fees paid for the cancelled course.

EMERGENCY/WEATHER CLASS CANCELLATIONS

Classes at Trinity are expected to meet according to the announced schedule. Unless cancellation of classes is announced publicly through the local communication media and at www. trinitydc.edu, classes will meet. When cancellation of classes is necessary, instructors are expected to arrange additional readings, study assignments, or class meetings to compensate for the lost time in class. The emergency/weather cancellation number is 202.884.9009. You may also consult the weather blog for weather-related cancellations and request school-wide weather alerts via text message by sending the message "Follow trinitydcalerts" to 40404 on your cell phone.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

You may view and make payments to your student account in Self-Service. Students are expected to pay all fees and any previous balances in full or to make satisfactory arrangements for payment before the first day of classes. Students without a payment arrangement by the first day of class will be charged a late fee. If you have questions or concerns about your payment, please contact Enrollment Services at 202.884.9530.

METHODS OF PAYMENT

1. Credit Cards

Students may submit payment in Self-Service using MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover credit cards. To pay your student account using Self-Service:

- Log into Self-Service at https://selfservice. trinitydc.edu.
- On the left-hand side of the page under "Student Record," you will see a tab that says "Online Payment."
- Click on the "Online Payment" tab. You will see a summary of your balance,

- charges, and credits along with a box at the bottom that says "Amount to Pay."
- Enter the amount that you wish to pay into this box and click "Submit."
- Enter your credit card information. Please note that the 3-digit security card on the back of a MasterCard, Visa and Discover card is required, as is the 4-digit code on the front of the American Express card.
- Click "Continue" after verifying that your information is correct.
- A confirmation screen will appear showing that the charge was successful and has been applied to your account.
- You can verify your payment through clicking on the "Account Information" tab and selecting the current semester.

Please note that your credit card information will be stored securely in Self-Service, with the exception of your security code. Your full credit card number is securely encrypted through Self-Service.

2. Check or Money Order

Checks should be made payable to Trinity Washington University and sent to the Business Office, Trinity Washington University, 125 Michigan Avenue, NE, Washington, DC 20017. Make sure to include your name, Trinity student ID number (000-XX-XXXX), and contact number on your check or money order.

3. Employer Vouchers

Trinity also accepts employer vouchers from companies that assist their employees with tuition. If your employer provides financial assistance, you will need to submit a voucher every semester to generate employer billing at the time you seek financial clearance. Students are required to pay all fees and costs not covered by their employer prior to the beginning of the

4. INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PLAN

Trinity allows students to arrange for payment of tuition in monthly installments over the course of the semester. There is a fee for participation, but there are no interest charges. Students may sign up for the automatic payment plan in Self Service under My Finances. The plan is not available for Summer, May, Winter, or other accelerated terms. Please contact Enrollment Services at www.trinitydc.edu/enrollment or 202.884.9530 for more information.

FINANCIAL AID

Trinity recognizes that today, more than ever before, investing in education requires planning, and so the University is prepared to assist students and their families in making higher education affordable through financial planning and counseling and installment payment Financial aid is awarded on the basis of demonstrated and verifiable financial need as determined by subtracting the student's estimated contribution from the total cost of education for the respective academic year. Students applying for financial aid will be considered for all programs for which they are eligible, and assistance is generally a combination of grant, loan and employment funds. Trinity participates in all Federal Title IV student financial assistance programs. You should contact Enrollment Services at 202.884.9530 as early as possible to discuss tuition planning for your university education.

Trinity provides financial aid through its endowed scholarships, loan funds, and its allocation of non-endowed operating revenues. It also administers funds available through federal programs. Individuals should also seek aid from state and local programs for which they are eligible. Currently, about 90% of the student body receives some type of financial assistance.

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

To apply for financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Renewal FAFSA. Trinity's school code is 001460. An application may be completed online at www.fafsa.gov. The priority deadline for the fall semester is April 1. Students beginning their academic program in the spring semester should file the FAFSA by October 1 of the previous year. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Financial obligations to Trinity are governed by the principle of Honor. Fulfilling financial obligations is a matter of justice for the entire community, and failure to meet those obligations has severe consequences for the entire community.

Students are responsible for the timely payment of their accounts, even if parents, family members, employers or others pay the bill. Students and families that need financial assistance are expected to work directly with Enrollment Services. These students are expected to complete their financial aid applications each year by the published deadlines. Book vouchers are a service the University provides to students

who have a credit balance on their student accounts. Late financial aid applicants will not receive a book voucher.

Students with outstanding balances will not have their course registrations processed until their financial obligations are satisfied or arrangements for payment have been made. Trinity reserves the right to refuse a payment plan if the prior financial conduct of the student or family indicates an inability or unwillingness to meet financial obligations to Trinity in a timely way.

ADMISSION

The Office of Admissions website (www.trinity-dc.edu/admissions) provides detailed information on the admissions requirements for all undergraduate and graduate programs offered by Trinity Washington University. Please contact the Office of Admissions staff at admissions@trinitydc.edu or 202.884.9400 for further information on these requirements.

Admission Requirements: The requirements for admission vary by academic program.

- Applicants to all undergraduate degree programs must provide official documentation of a completed a high school degree from an accredited secondary institution (high school) with a minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; of a passing college ready score on the GED; or a home school transcript demonstrating college readiness.
- Applicants seeking to transfer into an undergraduate degree program must provide an official transcript of all college level coursework completed for evaluation.
- Applicants to all graduate programs must provide official documentation of a completed a bachelor's degree from an appropriately accredited institution of higher learning with a minimum undergraduate GPA of a 2.8 on a 4.0 scale. Please note the School of Nursing and Health Professions requires a minimum cumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for admission consideration for the Master of Science in Nursing Program. International applicants are required to provide official documentation of English language proficiency through a passing TOEFL or IELTS exam score; an official evaluation of education obtained outside of the U.S.; and the Trinity International Student Supplemental form.
- International applicants may only apply for a full-time student status. If accepted for admission, students must demonstrate sufficient funds to cover expenses for at least one academic year.

The following materials are required for admission consideration into any program:

- An online application
- An admissions essay (relevant to the school and degree program you are applying to)
- One or more letters of recommendation
- Official copies of all transcripts

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Department of Public Safety (DPS) at Trinity is a full-service public safety provider with responsibility for campus safety, campus crime awareness and campus crime prevention and education. Additionally, DPS has oversight of parking services, ID card services, shuttle bus transportation, emergency management services, residential security and a vast

array of duties including staffing special events, providing safety escorts, administering vehicle assistance and managing vehicular and traffic control on campus. Located in Main Hall, Room B8, DPS is operational 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Our Communications Center is staffed by a DPS Officer (dispatcher) at all times.

Reporting Crime, Unusual or Suspicious Activity, and Other Emergencies:

DPS officers patrol the campus on foot and by vehicle, responding to all calls for service received by the department, whether criminal or non-criminal in nature, both on and immediately near the campus. DPS reports major offenses to appropriate law enforcement authorities and emergency care providers as needed or as required. We encourage students, faculty, staff and guests to immediately report all suspicious or unusual activity by calling x9111 from a campus phone or 202.884.9111 from an off-campus location.

LIBRARY SERVICES

The Sister Helen Sheehan Library provides access to Trinity's online catalog as well as the holdings of major university libraries in the D.C. region, and offers a range of databases as well as research help, internet access, computers, and printing.

The Library also houses the Academic Services Center, which provides study skills workshops, writing and math assistance and advice, and tutoring in a variety of subjects. There are also several classrooms and multimedia rooms in the building; the latter can be used as study spaces or to watch or listen to films and music as well as to record presentations.

PARKING

In order to park on campus, all students, faculty, staff, affiliates and guests must register their vehicle(s) with DPS and display a current parking sticker, visitor pass or temporary parking permit at all times in their car. Parking permits may be obtained through the parking permit website- https://trinity.thepermitstore. com/. Parking permits must be affixed inside the front windshield, in the upper left corner (driver's side). The permit mist be clearly visible through the front windshield to ensure maximum visibility and expeditious traffic flow up on entering campus access points.

What you need to register your vehicle and obtain a parking permit:

- Last Name (as it is in Self-Service)
- Vehicle Info: License Plate, State, Year, Color, Make, Model of Car
- Valid Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express Card

Parking restrictions are enforced 7 days per week, 24 hours per day, year round. Students may park only in lots designated for students; violations may result in fines which will be assessed to your student account.

PICTURE IDENTIFICATION

A key component of campus security is for all students, faculty and staff to carry their Trinity identification card while on campus. In order to ensure a safe and comfortable learning community, DPS checks ID cards for all people entering campus buildings. Photos for Trinity IDs will be taken during Payment Arrangement. If you miss the Payment Arrangement period, please visit Enrollment Services in Main 154 for a payment arrangement form that can be taken to DPS to have an ID made. A \$15 fee is assessed to replace lost or stolen ID cards.

PLACEMENT TESTING

Some undergraduate students are required to take placement assessments prior to enrolling in some entry-level classes. Admissions officers and academic advisors will inform students if they are required to take an assessment. Results from the assessments may be used to place students in mathematics or biology courses. You may schedule a date to take the assessments at www.trinitydc.edu/academic-services/appointments or by contacting the Academic Services Center in the Sister Helen Sheehan Library, 202.884.9636 or skillsassessment@trinitydc. edu. Most students will not need to take this assessment.
